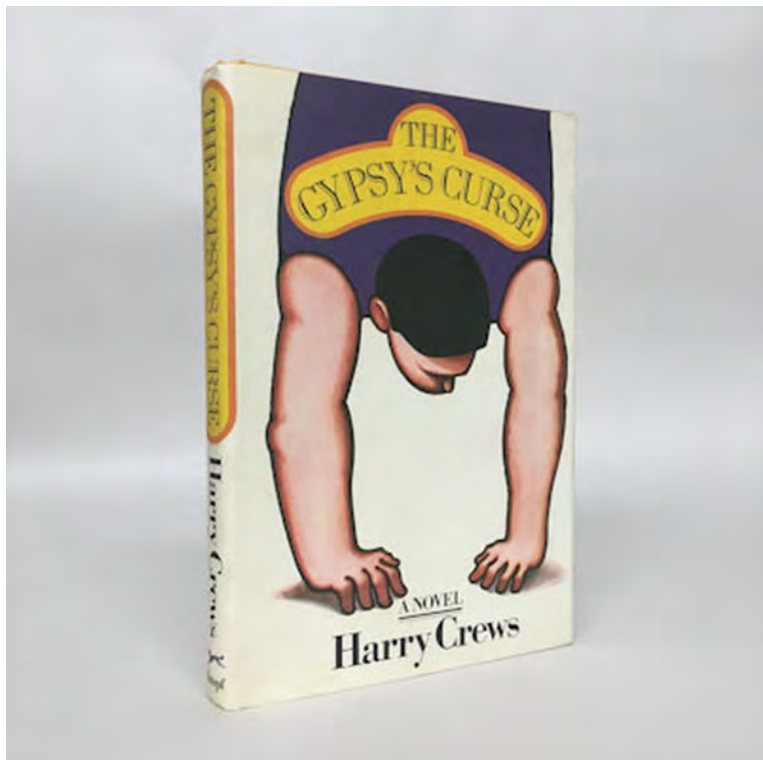

Crews's third novel, "the story of the struggle between life (a woman) and death (another woman) for the small body and large soul of a midget masseur named Jefferson Davis Munroe"—the dust jacket.

The dedication of this novel reads, "To the memory of my boy Patrick Scott Crews, 1960–1964." Patrick drowned in a neighbor's pool.

First edition (first printing, with no additional printings noted). A fine copy in a fine dust jacket with minute wear at the spine ends of the jacket and what may be a faded remainder mark on the top edge. This copy has a terrific inscription, written, apparently, on a very bad day: "To Tom Garner, the way of all flesh; we know of no exceptions. Ain't life fucking grand? Fuck the whole fucking world. Love Harry Crews." The recipient was a Texas attorney and friend of Crews. (306943)

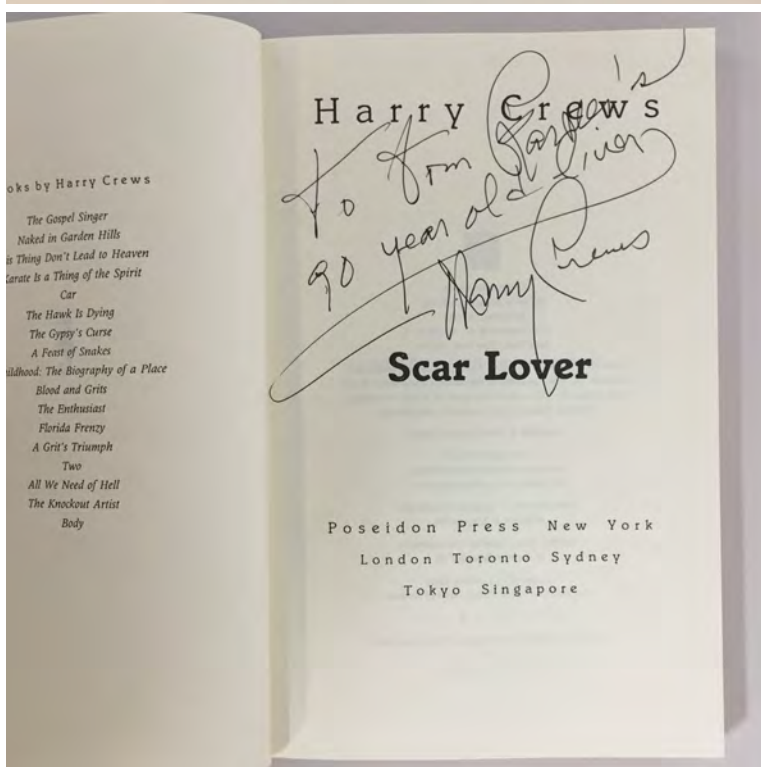

A novel of love and life in Jacksonville, Florida.

First editions (first printings with a numberlines ending in 1). Both copies with publisher's review slips laid in; one with the publisher's press release. Both copies are near fine in near fine dust jackets.

The long inscriptions in these two books explain Crews' dedication of the book to the actor Sean Penn and his admiration of James Dickey, a quote from whom is the epigraph for the book. The inscriptions, both to Crews's friend, Tom Garner, of Texas, incorporate Penn and Dickey's printed name into the inscription. The first inscription reads (in part): "[Sean Penn] a tough fucking guy you'd love. Our kind of people. If he can't do it, it can't be done..." The second reads in part, "[James Dickey] –the toughest and most honest man I've known. A night fighter pilot in two wars. At 70, still a quart-of-vodka-a-day man."

Easily two of the best and most revealing inscriptions I've seen in a Harry Crews book (and Tom Garner's collection had a lot of them). (306966)

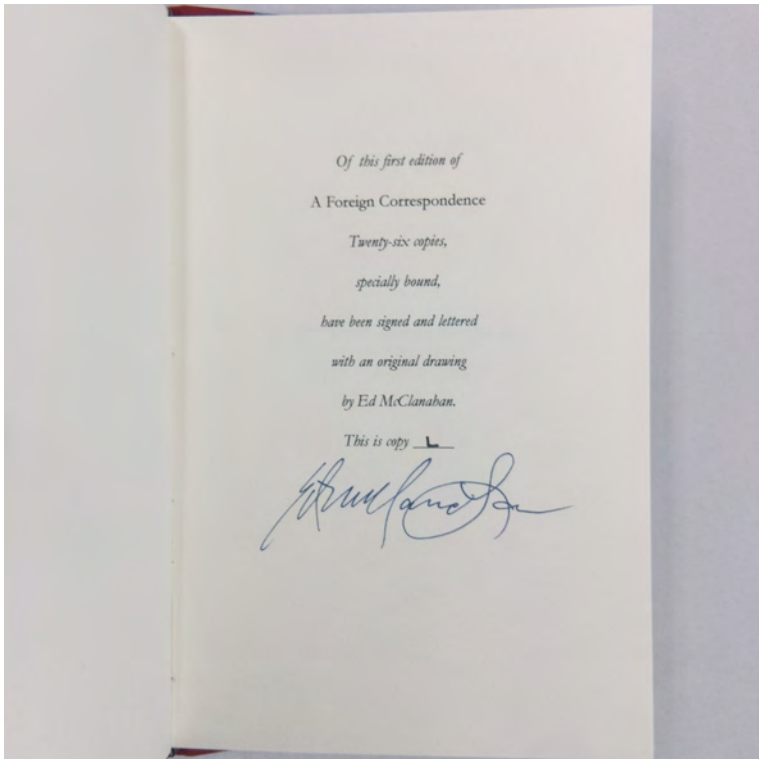

A brief account of a minor traffic accident in England in 1984 and the bureaucratic response from the insurance company. Title-page and cover label lettering by Ralph Steadman. McClanahan was a Stegner Fellow at Stanford University, where he met Ken Kesey and became a Merry Prankster.

The edition seems to have been just 26 copies, all lettered and signed by McClanahan, with an original drawing recreating the diagram of the accident, which he was asked to supply by the insurance company.

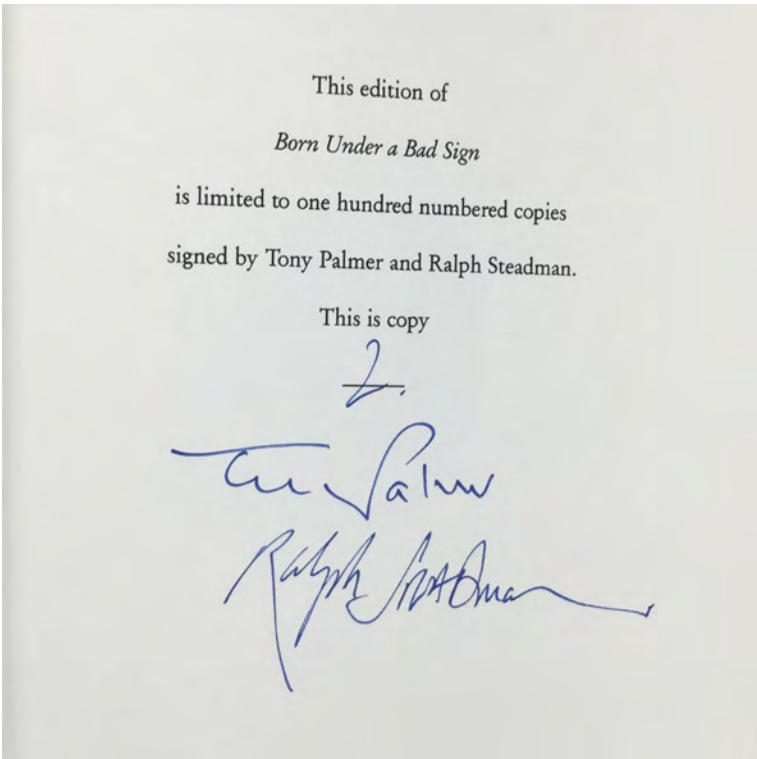

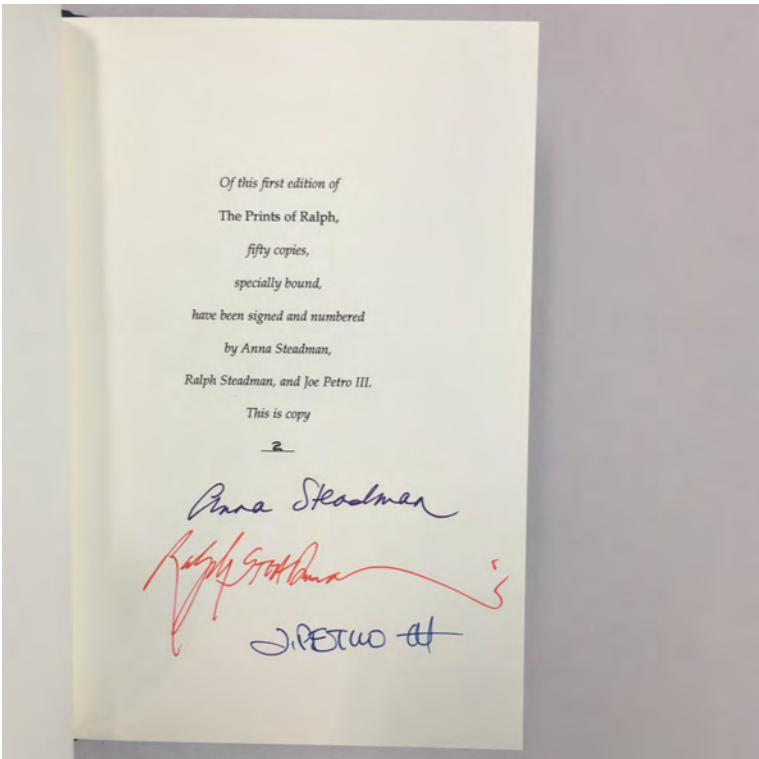

This edition is also signed by Ralph Steadman, Anna Steadman, and Joe Petro III and lays into a folding clamshell box. The endpapers are described on the colophon as "original pieces of Ralph Steadman's drawing board backing paper." These look like abstract art.

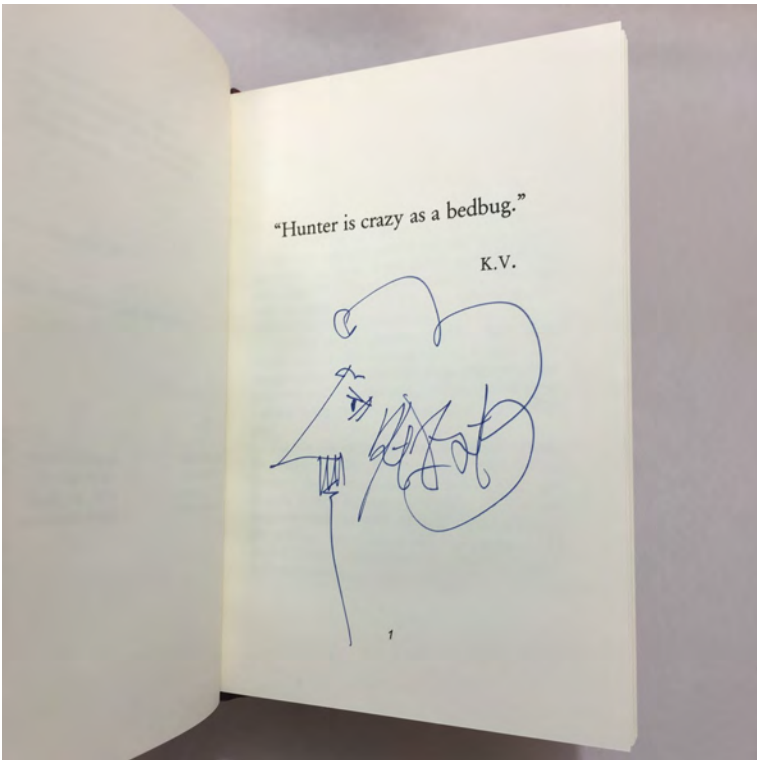

The edition was 140 copies. This is one of 26 lettered copies laid into a folding clamshell box. A full-page original Steadman drawing of HST is bound in. The book is signed by Ralph Steadman, Anna Steadman, and Joe Petro III on the colophon and by Kurt Vonnegut on the introduction page.

A fine copy in a fine slipcase. This is copy H of 26, signed by the Steadmans, Petro, and Vonnegut. This is one of 11 copies (letters A to K), in which Vonnegut signed with a self-portrait. The prospectus for the edition is laid in. (306963)

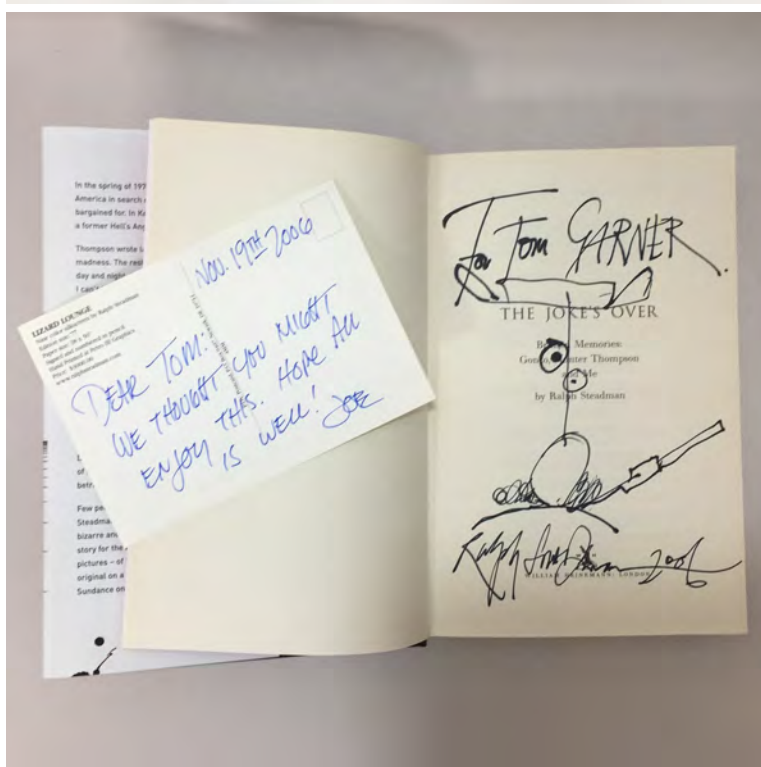
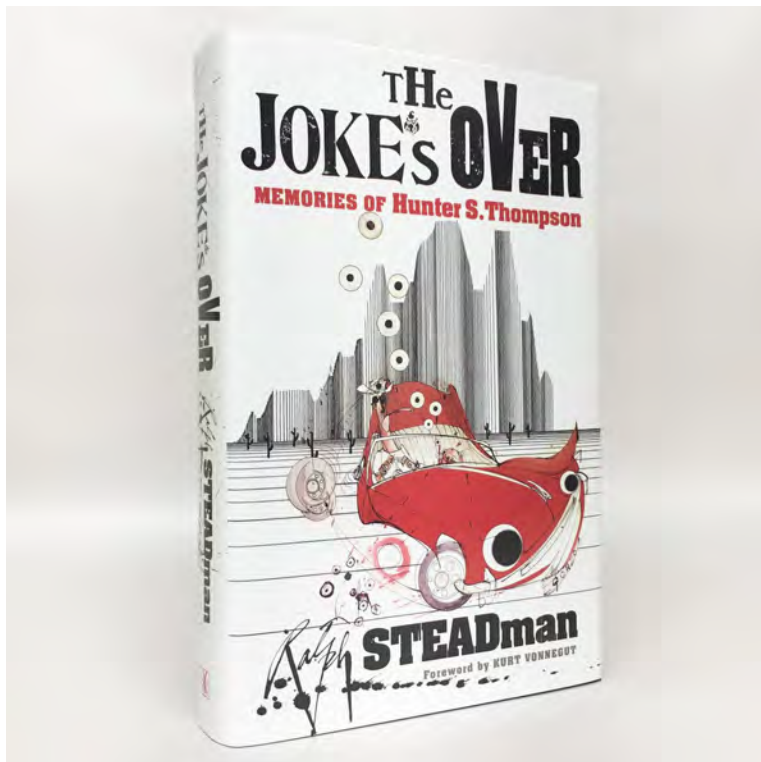

51 pages. One of 176 copies of an early and previously unpublished short story by Thompson, written when he was living in New York about a struggling writer in Greenwich Village. Illustrated in typically exuberant style by Steadman.

This is one of 26 lettered copies, bound in black and red cloth, with a leather spine label stamped in gilt. Each of the lettered copies is accompanied by a small 5-by-7-1/2 inch two-color silkscreen of a red-eyed Dr. Gonzo. The silkscreen is signed and lettered by Steadman and laid into folded paper covers. The book and silkscreen are laid into a folding clamshell box with a leather label.

First edition (first printing). A fine hardcover copy; no dust jacket, as issued. The silkscreen and its folded cover is also fine. This is copy B of 26. Signed by both Thompson and Steadman, with the silkscreen also signed by Steadman. The slipcase is fine; the leather label has minute scuffing. (5647)
